HOW TO ACCESS NASCOP SURVEILLANCE ELEARNING COURSES


To access the Surveillance eLearning courses, there are two steps:

- A. Logging into the learning site and
- B. Enrolling into your course of choice.


Here below are details of the two steps:

A. Register/Log in the learning site


- I. From your browser, open the learning site on <https://ehealth.uonbi.ac.ke/> (you can click this link or type on your browser).



- II. If you are new on this site, you will need to create a new account by clicking the button 'New Account'. You will create your own username and password as well as give profile details requested. An email will be sent to the email address you provide for you to confirm your account before proceeding, so be keen to type your email address accurately.




- III. If you already have an account on the <https://ehealth.uonbi.ac.ke> learning site, log in using your username and password



- IV. If you forgot your password, use the [forgot username/password link](#), appearing just below the Login button.

B. Enrolling to the course

- I. Once you are logged in, click the link '*NASCOP Surveillance Courses*'.



- II. You should see a video of broad introduction for NASCOP SIRI courses. **Scroll** below the video to see the course you want to enroll into.

Course Title: IMPLEMENTING HIV CASE BASED SURVEILLANCE IN KENYA

Goal: The goal of this course is to equip health managers and health care work in Kenya with capacity to implement HIV Case Based Surveillance.

Course Description: In this course, you will understand the various concepts of HIV Case Based Surveillance (CBS), sentinel events, data sources, reporting, and data management for CBS as well as how the routine HIV services delivery actions affect the quality of CBS data.

Course Details: The CBS course is free of charge. No tuition fees apply for this course. You will receive a certificate of completion with Continued Professional Development (CPD) points.

Enrollment: You can self-enroll on this course by clicking the access link below.

IV. Once inside the course, read through the instructions and learn sequentially - from left-most course tab (*Introduction*) to the last tab (*Post Course Survey*).

Remember that **learning is sequential**. E.g. you have to *Consent* before accessing *Pre-Course survey*.

About HIV Case Based Surveillance (CBS) Course

The goal of this course is to equip health managers and health care workers in Kenya with the capacity to implement HIV Case Based Surveillance. Further, this course aims to elaborate on their different roles and responsibilities in supporting the MOH in implementation of CBS within the country, and finally, how to use CBS data for program improvement and public health response.

The CBS course is free of charge. You will receive a certificate of completion with 10 Continued Professional Development (CPD) points.

The CBS course is developed by the Research and Implementation (SIRI) unit at the National AIDS and STI Control Programme (NASCO) in the Ministry of Health, Kenya with technical support from Global Programs for Research and Training, an affiliate of the University of California San Francisco (UCSF) and with funding from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC)-Kenya.
